 - Councillor Hunter asked how much of a general surplus is needed to bank roll the Town's Operations and Maintenance. The Finance Manager will get an answer and report back. Councillor Hunter also asked if the Finance Manager could recommend what would be an appropriate amount to put into reserves.
 - The SAO noted that the MDA is complete and will be published along with the financial statements.
 - Councillor Hunter asked if staff could publish when and how often the dump is pushed.
 - Councillor Wever asked if it is possible to get a sign to change the landfill hours seasonally. The Public Works
 Manager responded that signs on the way; one will be displayed on the road on the way up to the Landfill and
 one will be on site. The signs have stickers which can be removed/changed when Landfill hours change.
 - KBL is coming to Town September 4th and will be working in two phases (vehicles/contaminated waste).
 Majority of the waste is to be shipped out on the winter road this year.
 - There have been many compliments received regarding the Landfill:
 - o The Norman Wells Landfill has been used in MACA training pamphlets.
 - The Landfill is being used as an example across the Territory.
 - Canadian North Survey results to be published along with an explanation of what will be done with the data that has been collected. The survey resulted in some of the best public engagement today.z
 - Landfill information to be printed in small batches for landfill staff to handout.
- b) Action Items of Administration Tracking
 - Councillor Hunter noted that he was unable to open the tracking sheet. He asked the Recreation Manager for an
 update regarding the placement of a picnic table by the skate park. The Recreation Manager responded that
 they are assessing picnic table stock and will ensure one is place by the skate park.
 - Councillor Hunter also asked if there is a tentative pool opening date. The Recreation Manager responded that the pool could potentially be open this weekend or June 17.
 - Councillor Hunter asked for an update regarding potholes on Franklin and near the legion. The Public Manager will provide council with a further update but noted that repairs will be made within the next 2-3 weeks before chipseal.

This was work that was completed two years ago and tagged on to additional changes being made by the Fire Chief. Councillor Wever suggested removing "fire bans and restrictions" for further discussion. He noted that it is quite a big change for the community and asked how the changes could be communicated. Councillor Hunter suggested that Council approve fire bans. The SAO noted that if a policy is put in place it must give clear direction to the Fire Chief who acts under the direction of Council. 9. Council Forum

Councillor Peachey asked when Public Works would be clearing the brush obstructing views on some corners. The public works manager responded that work would be starting on Thursday starting with Mt Avens. Councillor Peachey advised council that she attended her first regional wellness council meeting. She will send the minutes to council once they are approved.

Councillor Wever noted the Town Planning Committee has been discussing yard maintenance and property standards. He asked what the leftover soil at the Landfill is being used for. Lucas responded that it is not the best soil but would be good if used for fill. Each resident will be offered 5 loads. Councillor Wever also noted that he has been approached by residents with a high level of concern regarding drugs in the community. He suggested council make this issue a priority in partnership with the new RCMP coming in.

Councillor Audet asked if a date had been set for the town wide clean up. Staff noted the clean up day had been completed on a day that Councillor Audet was out of town. He noted that there is still a lot of garbage in the ditches in the DOT area. The SAO responded that littering is an issue, and that staff could work on an anti-littering campaign and

add to Council Communications. Councillor Audet also asked about clearing vegetation on the river side of Mackenzie Drive. He noted local contractors would appreciate that work.

Councillor Hunter asked for an update on Council's public meeting with the Town's Lawyer present. Mayor Pope responded that things are in motion at this time and when there is something to update the public on, a meeting will be held.

Mayor Pope noted that Bandy Lake will be closed for the summer due to the hauling of material in the area. He also noted that street sweeping was not much of a benefit this year and that something should be done about dust control. MP Michael McLeod will be in town for July 1st celebrations and would like to meet with Council on July 2nd if everyone could try and make themselves available. Mayor Pope also reminded council that the plan to have an appreciation barbeque for the fire department will happen when time allows.
